








CLIENT SUCCESS STORIES



Meet Jessica, a survivor of human trafficking who found hope and support through It's Going To Be OK (IGTBOK). Trafficked at a young age, Jessica endured abuse and exploitation. Against all odds, she was rescued by a friend. After escaping her traffickers, Jessica was lost and scared, not knowing where to turn. IGTBOK provided her with a safe place to stay, access to counseling, and job training. Today, she is a survivor advocate, helping others break free from the cycle of exploitation.

Even after more than a decade, it is still difficult for Jessica to talk about her experience. However, she hopes her story will compel teenagers to look out for themselves and others. Jessica met Dr. Tonya Stafford at the premiere of the documentary "Be The One." "I remember thinking she wouldn't like me because I was gay, but she took me with open arms and brought me into the program," Jessica said. Tonya moved her to Dallas and put her in counseling, which she was initially afraid of but found it to be transformative. "It was real counseling, and I began to heal. I stayed with the program for three years. Tonya did everything for me. She became my mom. I tell people now she is my mom!"

Jessica remembers friends being shocked to finally learn her story because she was always putting on a happy face. "But God compensated me with good people around me, moms who really love me and want the best for me without cost," she said. Jessica was distrustful of people, but thanks to Tonya, she learned that good people still exist. "It's Going To Be OK wanted the best for me and gave me the best. Thank you for helping me achieve my dreams, for making me feel safe, and for showing me the real meaning of family and love.
